

3.1.7.5 Adjusting the Stitch Length

Sewing step; depending on the type of fabric, the location of the sewing and on request. The sewing step is the millimeter size of a unit of the sewing line. Sewing steps of different sizes are created by means of the sewing length button.

The length of the stitch can be adjusted with the stitch length adjuster (numberer) on the machine neck. Although sewing machines vary according to their brands, sewing length adjustment between 0 and 5 can be made.

The numbers on the numerator are expressed in mm with the stitch pitch. If the number is small, the stitch pitch is small, the larger the number, the larger the stitch steps.

For example, if the numerator is set to 2.5, then $10\text{mm} / 2.5 = 4$ (1cm means 4 sinking.)

The sewing step depends on the thickness and type of the fabric. Sewing is more frequent in fancy fabrics. Combining the fabric is the basis. The stitching step in modern and sports stitches is rare.
