

## 1.8. Emergency Procedures

Emergency, all or part of the workplace that may occur in the fire, explosion, spill resulting from hazardous chemicals, such as emergency response to natural disasters, fight, are events that require first aid or evacuation.

**emergency situations that may be encountered in the workplace can be summarized as follows:**

- Fire
- Explosion
- Hazardous chemical spill
- Natural disasters
- First Aid and incidents and accidents requiring evacuation
- food poisoning
- Sabotage

other emergencies, depending on the nature of the work must be included in emergency plans.

**purposes of preparation of emergency plans;**

- always claimed to be ready for emergencies,
- quickly and effectively to limit the cases in which the cause of the emergency,
- management of emergency situations to take control of the business rather than reach the emergency services,
- Information given to the outside emergency team and equipment that come to assist,
- Ensuring all employees are protected from the adverse effects of bystanders and emergency

as it can be listed.

Urgent matters to be considered when determining the conditions are as follows:

- Risk assessment results
- the possibility of fire and chemical spill and explosion-welded
- First aid and evacuation to require events
- Natural disasters
- Sabotage

to combat workplace emergency response and emergency search and rescue and evacuation, fire fighting and first aid teams should be appointed and exercise should be done at least once a year.
